A STORY OF FORGIVENESS

Over the past few weeks, we have been listening to the miracles that Jesus performed. Beginning with the Wedding Feast in Cana, the healing of the leper, the healing of the hemorrhaging woman, and the raising of the daughter of the leader of the synagogue who was believed to be dead, they each had one thing in common---their faith in Jesus Christ. We heard this throughout the scripture readings that these people were suffering humbled themselves, kneeling at the feet of Jesus, and knowing that they were in the presence of God believed that Jesus could cure them and their loved ones; that Jesus was the way for them to find inner peace for their sufferings, and that only with Jesus could they be healed.

The question we must ask ourselves right now is how strong is our faith in Jesus? Do we really rely on Him to help us through our difficult times? Do we really believe that "if it is His will" we will be heard and that He will answer our prayers? Nothing is impossible with God's help and mercy. We have heard this throughout sacred scripture and we have seen in the lives of so many people. It is with faith and belief in Jesus that we will be able to continue our lives with peace and harmony with those around us.

When we realize that we have wronged others or others have wronged us, we must let go in order to heal; to find inner peace with ourselves and others. As we walk this journey of Christ's passion, may we find the strength to move on, let go, and find the peace that lies within us. The Season of Lent is our time to recognize our strength with the help and mercy of Jesus Christ and to renew ourselves with one another just as Jesus did when He said "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Let each of us let go, no matter how small or large the hurt may be, and by doing so, this Season of Lent and the sacrifice of our Lord will find its' way into our hearts and lives. It is only then that

we will know what inner peace is. This is my prayer for all of us this Lenten Season. God bless all of you.

BISHOP GREGORY ADRESSES THE CORONAVIRUS

Parishioners of Dear OLOP: As all of you have heard Sunday evening, Governor Baker has issued latest restrictions regards Coronavirus for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. These restrictions include no more than 25 people gathering for any event, including religious services. This news has left our parishes in Massachusetts to question how we should proceed to minister to the faithful, especially now in your time of need. I informed Bishop Gregory last night about these latest developments and asked for his guidance. He has issued these guidelines for Eparchy of Saint Maron Brooklyn.

During this time of crisis, the faithful are not obliged to attend Divine Liturgy on Sunday and have been given dispensation. I would like to add to that, if anyone is at risk in anyway, I encourage you NOT to attend Divine Liturgy. You know who you are are and this information is readily available on the CDC website. I am also reminded that during the most difficult times in or lives, we feel comfort by attending Church. Bishop Gregory has asked that Divine Liturgy be available for those who would like to attend. For those of you who are NOT at risk and would find solace in attending, you are most welcome. The State of Massachusetts has stated that no more than 25 people may be gathered in one particular place. I can use pastoral prudence as it pertains to this.

Friday Lenten Services will go on as usual. It is my hope that we will soon be offering Live Stream video so that everyone may tune into our services. My main priority is you and the health of your family. We do not want to jeopardize anyone whatsoever. All social gatherings

and coffee hours will be suspended until further notice.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, I know challenging these are times spiritually, emotionally, and financially. But I ask you to remain steadfast resolute in following the guidelines set forth by our officials and to continue to pray for those affected by this virus and those who are working tirelessly to exterminate this virus. Our committee will be meeting this Thursday evening. I will notify you of any new developments as well as how you can long- in to join me with Divine and Friday Lenten Liturgy Services. ANNUAL BISHOPS CHARITY APPEAL



The money is divided as follows: 30% for priests' retirement, 25% go towards the seminarian's education and boarding, 15% goes toward our endowment fund, 15% Patriarchal liturgical goes to commission and texts, and 15% goes to Lebanon. Each parish in the eparchy is asked to send an amount based on the size of the parish and the ability to raise this money for these much-needed programs.
