ANNUAL BISHOPS CHARITY APPEAL

Each year the Eparchy of St. Maron of Brooklyn appeals to each parish for the annual Bishops Charity Appeal. The money is divided as follows: 30% for priests' retirement, 25% go towards the seminarian's education and boarding, 15% goes toward our endowment fund, 15% Patriarchal goes to liturgical commission and texts, and 15% goes to Lebanon. All of you have been very generous in the past and I am confident we will raise the amount requested. Thus far we have collected \$1,358.00 toward that amount.
