CORPUS CHRISTI

The first and the second coming of Christ are familiar concepts that we have heard off. However, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux speaks of a third coming between these two in which Jesus comes in spirit and power for our rest and consolation. The feast of Corpus Christi (the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) is a great reminder of that "middle coming" where Jesus comes to us as " the food" (viaticum) to comfort us in our journey.



Former US President Richard Nixon is infamous for his place at the center of the Watergate scandal. He disgraced both the office of the President of the United States and the United States itself in the eyes of the world. 
