Martyrdom of 350 Martyrs, Disciples of St Maron – 31 July

After St Maroun died, many were inspired by his teachings and his ascetic way of life. By the fifth century a monastery was built near where he lived known as Bet Maroun. The monastery became very significant in the region. Also, in the fifth century a debate had emerged about the nature of Jesus. The debate centered on whether Jesus was divine, human or both and exactly what that meant. Some, like the Nestorians, argued that Jesus was separately divine and

human and that the two natures were independent. Others such as the Jacobites taught that Jesus was only divine and his divinity absorbed his human nature.

In 451, The Council of Chalcedon dealt with the debate once and for all, declaring that Christ was both divine and human, but one person.

The Maronites upheld the proclamation of the Council of Chalcedon. The monks of Saint Maroun led the way preaching the true doctrine and opposing heresy. We learn of the martyrdom of the 350 Monks in a letter from the monks to Pope Hormisdas in the year 517. They

described the suffering and attacks they are enduring, particularly from the Antiochian Patriarchs Severus and Peter who opposed the teachings of the Council of Chalcedon. They described that they were mocked for their support of the Council and were suffering afflictions. The described how the Emperor Anastasius had sent an army that had marched through the district Apamea monasteries and expelling the monks. Some monks had been beaten and others had been thrown into prison. While on their way to St. Simon Stylite, the Maronites had been ambushed and 350 monks

were killed, even though some of them had taken refuge at the altar. The monastery was burned. The letter was signed by Alexander, priest and archimandrite and over 200 other signatures followed, of other archimandrites, priests and deacons.


We pray that like the 350 Martyrs we are always obedient to the teachings of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

ملخص العظة

أتت قراءة إنجيل اليوم في الوقت المناسب. مع كل الإضطرابات وكل الإضطهادات في عالمنا اليوم، هذه القراءة هي تذكير لنا من قبل يسوع المسيح. تذكير لكل ما يحصل مع كل مسيحيي العالم؛ كيف تُستهدف الكنائس مع إجوتنا وأخواتنا المسيحيين وكيف هم مهددون ومُضطهدون وكيف تُدمر الكنائس بسبب اسم يسوع المسيح.

يسألني الكثير من العالم عن سبب قراءتنا للعهد القديم. إنه طويل، مُربِك، ويقولون أن كل ما نريده هو العهد الجديد لأنّه يتمّم العهد القديم.

العهد القديم مهم لنا لأنه يخبرنا عن مجيء يسوع المسيح وما سيفعله لشعبه. ويخبرنا أيضاً عن المشقّات التي سيتحملها شعبه من أجل اسمه. يخبرنا لماذا أرسل الله ابنه الوحيد إلى العالم—ليخلصنا من خطيئتنا، ليحرّرنا من عبودية الشيطان ومن الموت الأبدي. خطيئة الإنسان وأفعاله جلبت الشر إلى العالم. وأتى يسوع إلينا ليتألّم عنّا ويخلصنا فنتنعم بالملكوت الأبدى.

يحذرنا بولس الرسول في رسالته إلى أهل قورنتوس من أمور عدّة. أخبرنا يسوع، كما تنبأ العهد القديم، عن أمور عدّة بأنه يجب نكون مستعدين لنصبح من أتباع يسوع المسيح.

المسيحيين الذين يواجهون الإضطهاد يفهمون كلام بولس الرسول في رسالته. هذه الكلمات تقويهم وتحميهم من التردد فتدخل هذه الكلمات قلوبهم وتساعدهم على تحمل المصائب والضيقات والمعاناة التي يواجهونها.

بعد 2000 سنة، لا نزال نواجه الإضطهادات نفسها كما واجهها الرسل وآباء الكنيسة الأولى. بعد 2000 سنة، نستمر بالتراجع عوضًا عن التقدم بسبب شر وأنانية هذا العالم.

في نهاية رسالته يعطينا بولس الرسول السلام والأمل: "أخسب كَاتَنَا مُضِلُونَ ونَحْنُ صَادِقُون! كَاتَنَا مُضِلُونَ ونَحْنُ مَعْرُوفُون! كَاتَنَا مَجْهُولُونَ ونَحْنُ مَعْرُوفُون! كَاتَنَا مَعْرُوفُون ونَحْنُ مَعْرُوفُون ونَحْنُ دَائِمًا وَنَحْنُ لَا نَمُوت؛ كَأَنَّنَا مَحْرُونُونَ ونَحْنُ دَائِمًا فَرَحُون! كَأَنَّنَا هُفَرَاءُ ونَحْنُ نَعْلِكُ كُلَّ شَيء!" كَأَنَّنَا لا شَيءَ عِنْدَنَا، ونَحْنُ نَعْلِكُ كُلَّ شَيء!" جميعنا متحدون مع إخوتنا وأخواتنا المعذين، أينما كانوا. مع سماعنا كلمات بولس الرسول، فلنتشبّث معهم لأننا واثقون أنّ الرسول، فلنتشبّث معهم لأننا واثقون أنّ

POPE FRANCIS ON HUMILITY

The "failure" of the cross reveals the "victory of God's love", Pope Francis said during his homily yesterday, where he insisted that God builds upon our weaknesses and uses them for good.

Speaking at Holy Mass in the Chapel of Santa Marta in Rome, the pontiff said the "story of love between God and people...seems to be a story of failure." Humanity has consistently rejected God, even rejecting Jesus to the point of his crucifixion on the cross, he added, according Vatican Radio. "The path of our redemption is a path marked by failure," Francis told gathered.

"This story that begins with a dream of love, that seems to be a love story, but ends up looking like a story of failures, ends with the great love of God who offers Salvation through the rejection of his Son who saves us all".

It is at the cross that God turns upside down our understanding of failure. Love triumphs at the cross; a place that would otherwise appear to one of defeat. "It is a scandal...but here is where love wins."

However, he also stressed that Christians will fail many times in their own journey, which "is a rough road".

"If each of us examines his conscience, he will see how many times...he has banished the prophets; how many times he has said to Jesus: 'Go away;' how many times he has wanted to save

himself. How many times we have thought we were the righteous ones," Francis said. But God uses us in our weakness, just as Christ was brutally murdered on the cross and yet rose in glory three days later. "The Son, His last envoy, was seized, killed and thrown out. He became the cornerstone."

It is important, therefore, for Christians to practice the same humility that Jesus did. "We do well to remember this love story that seems to fail, but in the end triumphs," Francis concluded.

"And to remember in story of our lives, the seed of love that God has sown in us and how it went, and doing the same thing that Jesus did on our behalf: he humbled himself."
