#### WE HAVE BEEN WARNED

Today's gospel reading is a stark reminder as we witness the terrible situations going on around us every day. Situations that threaten the safety and well-being of our families and friends. Situations that have no place in any world but especially a Christian world. And who warned us about these events over 2000 years ago? Jesus!

Each of us must take responsibility for our words and actions. We must realize that there are some injustices in this world towards people that must be faced with sincerity, compassion, and justice. And we must realize that there is a difference between bringing these injustices to light and threatening our neighbors and strangers around us. As Christians, we have an obligation to face these challenges with love and compassion. We cannot accept more hatred placed on innocent bystanders as a new normal and Jesus is warning each of us just that today.

"You will hear of wars and reports of wars; see that you are not alarmed, for these things must happen, but it will not yet be the end. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be famines and earthquakes from place to place. All these are the beginning of the labor pains. Then they will hand you over to persecution, and they will kill you. You will be hated by all nations because of my name. And then many will be led into sin; they will betray and hate one another. Many false prophets will arise and deceive many; and because of the increase of evildoing, the love of many will grow cold." (Matthew 24:6-12)

These are not words that would be used to win the hearts of those seeking to be followers of Christ. That is, if we take these words alone in order to convince ourselves to be Catholics. But when we understand Jesus' perspective and message, these words are the perfect words to bring the minds and hearts of others to Him. But, "these are the beginning of the labor pains," Jesus tells us. We will all have to witness these things in our lives.

But we also have promising news in this gospel reading. Jesus tells us that those who endure to the end will be saved. There is another place where there are no wars, no hatred, no disasters, no evilness, and no sin. But we must do everything we can in this life to be true witnesses of Christ's teachings. The time is now because those who endure to the end will be saved. This is our hope. This is our reward. This is Jesus' truth to us.
