## SUNDAY OF THE ENTRANCE INTO LENT MIRACLE AT CANA IN GALILEE

#### LET THE LENTEN JOURNEY BEGIN

Over the next several weeks we will reflect upon this quote from Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan and ask ourselves the question how will we, how can we answer God's call to be holy. Is this even possible with all the evil that exists around us; with all the temptations that invade our daily lives; with all the expectations to be perfect? Bishop Gerald Barbarito of the Diocese of Palm Beach once said "we are not called to be perfect; we are called to be holy." I recall pondering this remark in great depth and the first thing that came to my mind was isn't that the same thing? So, what does it mean to be holy and how do we achieve this state of grace? Called to be Holy, written by Cardinal Timothy Dolan, will be the major reference over the next several weeks. We will take this step by step and by doing so we can begin a new routine in our daily lives that will bring us closer to Jesus Christ: to know Jesus, to love Jesus, to trust Jesus, to obey Jesus, and to serve Jesus. Cardinal William Baum once preached, "The danger...is to know about Jesus without knowing Him, to talk about Jesus but not to Him, to let experts speak of Him without letting Him speak about Himself. A DEEP, INTIMATE PERSONAL, RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS

CHRIST IS THE FOUNDATION OF HOLINESS."

We will begin this journey to holiness with daily prayer. In our busy lives we neglect the need to take a moment to speak with Jesus. There may be days that His presence in our lives does not even exist, meaning that although we love Him and honor Him, sometimes we just don't think about Him. I am not saying that we should go about our daily lives calling His name every minute of the day. However, we need to take a moment or two every day to accept His love, offer our petitions, to give Him an opportunity to speak to us, and to give Him thanks and praise. This is how we encounter Jesus and build our deep relationship with Him. This is what He asks of us and this is how we achieve this state of holiness that we are asked to achieve.

This coming week, take some time and spend it with Jesus. Whether it is in the Church, in the privacy of our homes, offices, or in the park, sit alone, in silence, and speak to Jesus. Here are some suggestions for us to begin our journey to holiness:

- 1) Go into our room alone, close our eyes and speak to Jesus. Talk to Him about our concerns, our shortcomings, our needs, and let Him answer us.
- Use devotional items such as icons, crucifixes, statues, rosaries, and prayer cards. Sometimes we are not sure how to pray. Know that prayer has many different


ways to communicate with Jesus. These may consist of daily mass and Eucharistic Adoration. They also include quiet time of contemplation and meditation using our own words, using Catholic prayers, or sitting in peace and quiet allowing Jesus to enter our lives and speak to us as we listen.

3) Use the daily office (Maronite Daily Office or the Latin Daily Office) and follow each day using the prayers and scripture readings


