

HEALING OF THE HEMORRHAGING WOMAN

LET THE LENTEN JOURNEY BEGIN

As we continue our Lenten journey, this week we will reflect on the virtue of faith. What is faith? What does it mean to have faith?

In the Epistle to the Hebrews from St. Paul, we are told that "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." How do we obtain this faith that says it is the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen? Catholicism has been given to us from God through faith and through revelation. Much of our faith has been revealed to us from God by sending His Only Begotten Son to us in His human nature. Jesus Christ revealed to us who God the Father is and He also revealed to us the precepts and teachings so that we may be His followers. This was achieved through His ministry which was passed on to the apostles. It was through his suffering, his death, and His resurrection that we have been assured of this Truth. Most of our belief in God has been revealed.

Now what about faith? It is through what has been revealed to us by Jesus Christ that we are able to obtain the faith we need to understand those things that cannot be explained because of our human limitations. "Faith, of course, has as its object not propositions and doctrines directly, but a person, namely Jesus the Christ. We believe in Him, and thence flows our belief in what He and His Church have taught." (Cardinal Timothy Dolan)

An example of faith would be that of children. As Cardinal Dolan has beautifully exemplified, the faith that children have in their parents as infants or older is not rational but spontaneous and natural, part of their being. When they cry, you will come; when they are scared, you will hold them; when they are hungry, you will feed them; when they are lonely, you will hold them. In short, faith is part of our being and it is a grace that is given to us freely from God if we allow it to penetrate our lives.

Most people who have faith really don't think about it on a daily basis. This usually happens when life is going well, the family is healthy, the children are doing well in school, and life just seems to be going well. But the minute something tragic happens or life becomes so overwhelming for us, we fall back on our faith with much passion and much conviction. Sometimes this faith is questioned; sometimes we may ask ourselves do we really have faith if we are thinking this way or that way? Do we really have faith when we question God where He was or why we may feel abandoned?

Thomas Merton, a Trappist Monk, at probably a very trying moment in his life wrote the following:

"My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. Therefore, I will trust you always though I may seem to be lost in the

GUIDELINES FOR FASTING DURING LENT

Great Lent is a season of fasting and abstinence. Abstinence from the consumption of meat and meat products is required for all persons over 14 years of age on all Fridays of Great Lent. Fasting from all food and beverages (except for water and medicine) from midnight until noon is obligatory for all persons between 14 and 60 years of age on the following two important days: Ash Monday (February 15th) Great Friday of the Crucifixion (April 2nd).

Please note: Women who are pregnant and persons who are sick are not required to fast. Also, anyone who has a medical condition are also not required to follow these guidelines.


