LAST WEEK'S HOMILY

You have heard me talk about the differences of Martha and Mary and about the active life and contemplative life. This year I want to discuss a verse that Martha posed to Jesus. Lord, do you not care?

I am sure that there are times when that question comes to our heads. Perhaps when we are facing a health issue, lose a loved one, having difficulties with our jobs or our families.

I know I don't have to tell any of you that Jesus cares! Jesus cares about those who are sick; Those who have lost a loved one; Those who are homeless and marginalized; Those who are suffering in Lebanon, Syria and around the world; He cares about the helpless children affected by abuse, neglect and abortion; About His church and her people; He cares about those who have left this Church; And He cares about the priests and religious who minister to His people. Jesus Cares!!!

But the real question Jesus should be asking each of us is "Do we care?" And if so, just how much?

Make no mistake, Martha cared! She cared about welcoming Jesus, showing hospitality to Jesus.

But we, like Martha, get caught up in the activity of our lives too much; whereas, Mary showed Jesus hospitality in a manner we all need to notice. Although Jesus may have sounded a little insensitive to Martha, He too was very grateful to her for her hard work.

Mary, by sitting next to Jesus, was in essence praying with Jesus. She was listening. As you have heard me say before when we pray, we need to listen to what God is saying to us.

Many times, when we are so busy, we put off praying! Many times, when we are working, or donating our time to the Church with our hectic and busy lives, sometimes we can feel unappreciated or the work we do goes unnoticed. Pretty much the way Martha was feeling.

When we are suffering in our lives, we may ask ourselves "Does Jesus care? But all we have to do is remember our journey every year during Passion Week when we walk with Jesus as He graciously gave His life for us.

When we make time for Jesus---we care;

When we thank Jesus—we care;

When we push ourselves to give Him one hour a week in this Church—we care;

When we help those in need, feed those who are hungry, and see the face of God in others—we care;

When we not allow our pride, our faults, or other people's faults deflect us, and come to Church---we care!

And when we extend an olive branch to our adversaries or fallen away friends or parishioners—we care.

So, the question not to ask is "Jesus, don't you care---but rather ask ourselves "How much do we really care?"

بجلوسها مع يسوع، كانت مريم تصلي معه في جوهرها؛ كانت تنصت له. لقد قلت سابقًا أنه عندما نصلي يجب أن نصغي إلى ما يقوله الله لنا.

في كثير من الأحيان، عندما ننشغل كثيرًا نؤجل الصلاة! وفي كثير من الأحيان، عندما نعمل أو نقدم وقتنا للكنيسة رغم انشغالاتنا الحياتية،
