#### THE VIRTUE OF HUMILITY

Do any of us like to be humiliated either in private or in public? I know it is not on the top of my list. To be humiliated means that we are beneath other people; that we have failed in some way or another and that our pride is now at stake. But humility is one of the greatest virtues we can obtain. Humility makes us examine ourselves and to see ourselves and all of our defects, our faults. and our shortcomings. Humility requires us to see ourselves as we truly are and to submit ourselves completely and willingly to God. St. Thomas Aquinas defines humility in the Summa ""The virtue of humility", he says, "Consists in keeping oneself within one's own bounds, not reaching out to things above one, but submitting to one's superior." This is humility at its core. When we empty ourselves to God, we begin to understand more and more the need of forgiveness; the understanding of our faults; and the beginning of knowing ourselves with all of our shortcomings and our sinfulness. As St. Bernard has said "He lacks everything who thinks he lacks nothing." All of us need to strive for this virtue of humility and by doing so we not only see our own weaknesses and defects but we will be able to understand other's defects and weaknesses as well. And when this happens, we become more compassionate and forgiving to others. Humility is key to toward our journey to holiness.
