



FEAST DAY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

A feast called the Conception of Mary arose in the Eastern Church in the seventh century. It came to the West in the eighth century. In the 11th century it received its present name, the Immaculate Conception. In the 18th century it became a feast of the universal Church. It is now recognized as a solemnity.

In 1854, Pius IX solemnly proclaimed: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instant of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin."

It took a long time for this doctrine to develop. While many Fathers and

Church Doctors of the considered Mary the greatest and holiest of the saints, they often had difficulty in seeing Mary as sinless—either at her conception or throughout her life. This is one of the Church teachings that arose more from the piety of the faithful than from the insights of brilliant theologians. Even such champions of Mary as Bernard of Clairvaux and Thomas Aguinas could not theological justification for this

teaching.

Two Franciscans, William of Ware and Blessed John Duns Scotus, helped develop the theology. They pointed out that Mary's Immaculate Conception enhances Jesus' redemptive work. Other members of the human race are cleansed from original sin after birth. In Mary, Jesus' work was so powerful as to prevent original sin at the outset.

Reflection

In Luke 1:28 the angel Gabriel, speaking on God's behalf, addresses Mary as "full of grace" or "highly favored". In that context, this phrase means that Mary is receiving all the special divine help necessary for the task ahead. However, the Church grows in understanding with the help of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit led the Church, especially non-theologians, to the insight that Mary had to be the most perfect work of God next to the

PRAYER OF POPE SAINT JOHN XXIII TO MARY, QUEEN OF LEBANON

In 1954, the Church in Lebanon held a National Marian Congress. Ven. Pope Pius XII named then-Archbishop Angelo Roncalli, papal nuncio to Istanbul, to be his Cardinal Legate (i.e., representative) to the closing ceremonies. In his concluding homily for these, given October 24, the future Pope St. John XXIII gave the following prayer.

Now, O Mary, Queen of Lebanon and recently proclaimed Queen of the World, hear my prayer. The archangel who was the first to greet you called you, "full of grace." A great Doctor of the Church, St. Bernard, commented, "You are full of grace, and your grace overflows to us: You have more than enough grace for yourself, enough to spare for us."

O Mary, pour out the superabundance of your grace over this beloved nation of yours. For the first time in its long history it enjoys full liberty and political and social independence. May its decrees be ever inspired by principles of respect and fidelity for its glorious ancestral traditions; may its social life be characterized by those mystical gifts of unity and peace that are most fervent intention of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass which I am now celebrating under your loving gaze, O Mother, O Queen of Lebanon, in close sacrificial union with blessed Jesus, your Son and our Brother.

One more prayer, O Mary. In answer to the prayer of Jesus that all His brothers should be united among themselves and with Him, as He is united with the Father (cf. John 17:23), the promise of one fold under the pastoral staff of one shepherd (John 10:16) will surely be fulfilled; let the attainment of this unity for which all believers in Christ are longing begin here, in the land of Lebanon, through your intercession, O Mary!

The restoration of the catholicity of faith in all its breadth and perfection will be the most important event of modern times. May it be ascribed to your name, O Queen of Lebanon, as our Holy Father says in the words which I shall transmit to these your faithful people in his name

The Pope will say to the Lebanese, "Your fervor, renewed in these devotions to Mary, must be the salt that does not lose its savor, the light set on a candlestick so that its flame may be a light to all that are in the house; may the warmth of your charity be shown above all in welcoming your separated brethren, whose deep devotion to Mary is well known to us, and to whom in our encyclical *Fulgens* Corona we have sent a father invitation to join with us in appealing to Mary, and begging most earnestly for this unity" (Letter of Ven. Pius XII to the Cardinal Legate for the celebration of the National Marian Congress of Lebanon).

My dear Lebanese brothers, nothing is beyond the reach of prayer. The Archangel Gabriel is still here with us. The last word of his message is precisely this: "With God nothing will be impossible" (Luke 1:37).

So, courage and faith!

On the summit of the holy mountain the ancient cedars are still growing, ever growing, and their branches are still wide and robust enough to gather in a mystical embrace all who worship Christ "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:23). This will be the future glory of Lebanon, the glory of Mary, her Mother and Queen.

Amen.
