#### **GENEALOGY SUNDAY**

Today we celebrate Genealogy Sunday. In the gospel reading we hear many names, which at first, may seem a bit daunting and confusing. However, the importance and significance of this reading is the important take away for us today.

First, if you were to do some background checks on the relatives of Jesus Christ, you would know that He had some very colorful and sinful relatives. Why would one want to include such sinful people in their lineage? The answer to that question would be we are all sinful, and yet, we can all be redeemed and to be part of God's plan of salvation to others.

In addition to this, we had been told by the prophets of the Old Testament about the coming of the Messiah--the One who would save the world from their sins.
