FIRST SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

The Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ---God Reveals Himself to Us

The Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ is one of the oldest Christian feasts, though, throughout the centuries, it has celebrated a variety of things. *Epiphany* comes from a Greek verb meaning "to reveal," and all of the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to man.

History

Like many of the most ancient Christian feasts, Epiphany was first celebrated in the East, where it has been held from the beginning almost universally on January 6. Today, among both Eastern Catholics and Eastern Orthodox, the feast is known as Theophany—the revelation of God to man.

A Fourfold Feast

Epiphany originally celebrated four different events, in the following order of importance: the Baptism of the Lord; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the Nativity of Christ; and the visitation of the Wise Men or Magi. Each of these is a revelation of God to man: At Christ's Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God the Father is heard, declaring that Jesus is His Son; at the wedding in Cana, the

miracle reveals Christ's divinity; at the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him; and at the visitation of the Magi, Christ's divinity is revealed to the Gentiles the other nations of the earth.

The End of Christmastide

Eventually, the celebration of the Nativity was separated out, in the West, into Christmas; and shortly thereafter, Western Christians adopted the Eastern feast of the Epiphany, still celebrating the Baptism, the first miracle, and the visit from the Wise Men.

Thus, Epiphany came to mark the end of Christmastide—the Twelve Days of Christmas, which began with the revelation of Christ to Israel in His Birth and ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles at Epiphany. Over the centuries, the various celebrations were further separated in the West, and now the Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on the Sunday after January 6, and wedding at Cana commemorated on the Sunday after the Baptism of the Lord.

Epiphany Customs

In many parts of Europe, the celebration of Epiphany is at least as important as the celebration of Christmas. In Italy and other Mediterranean countries, Christians exchange gifts on Epiphany—the day on which the Wise Men brought

their gifts to the Christ Child—while in Northern Europe, it's not unusual to give gifts on both Christmas and Epiphany (often with smaller gifts on each of the twelve days of Christmas in between).

Hi, my name is Vivianne Khalife-Yazbeck and I am here asking for your support, not for me but for my friends' 14-year-old daughter and the humble family who would never think of asking for help. On Christmas Eve, Natalia Sarkis (a very healthy young girl) received an unexpected heartbreaking diagnoses of High-Risk leukemia. She will be undergoing aggressive Chemo therapy starting tomorrow and will still undergo different chemo treatments for the next 2 years. The first 4-6 weeks and at different times in her treatment she will not be able to leave the hospital and her mother will have to leave her job to care for her. Obviously, this has been a huge shock for the family and everyone surrounding them. This battle is just beginning and will be a very long road for Natalia and her entire family. We are confident she will beat this without a doubt and I ask everyone to help support the family. One way we can do that is by meeting their needs financially so they can concentrate only on helping Natalia get better. Even though medical insurance will cover most of her treatments, the family will have other unexpected expenses and the burden of a loss of income. Let this money raised help them in many ways:

gas money to and from hospital visits for her father and for the family for the next two years (over 1hr ride to the hospital)

therapeutic care

meals

any misc. services needed to lighten their load during this journey

help make up for the loss of income to help pay everyday bills.

Please keep the love, prayers, and positive thoughts coming for the family and for Natalia. I am sure they will appreciate any support and prayers. I want to go ahead and say THANK YOU, on their behalf.
