# **SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY**

### NEW YEAR'S FOOD FOR THOUGHT

With the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ and the ringing in of the New Year, we are once again reminded of a new hope. A hope that begins with Jesus Christ, as He came to us in His human nature, to offer us the forgiveness of sins and the promise of eternal life. It is with this hope that we begin, once again, to conform our lives in the true Catholic faith.

At times, new beginnings can be overwhelming, trying to figure out where to start, how to begin anew with loved ones and friends, and whether or not this new beginning will be fruitful. Many of us set New Year's resolutions only to succumb to our old ways. This can be very frustrating for us, nevertheless, we at least recognize our need to change our ways whether it be spiritually, physically, or emotionally. So how do we rely on the mercy of God's greatest gift given to us through the birth of our Lord?

Each of us must remember that we are human beings---incapable of perfection---but hopeful in holiness. Each of us must remember that we will make mistakes, bad judgments, or hurt others intentionally or unintentionally: in other words, lacking the perfection that is only found in God---Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And the important idea to remember is that if each of us understands our weaknesses and shortcomings, we will have a greater capacity to forgive and understand our human limitations. I often say to myself let me walk in the other person's shoes for a moment. What were they thinking when they did this or said that; what are they going through realizing that they may have made a bad judgment in handling a certain situation or made a mistake that would affect other people's lives? Perhaps it is at that moment that we realize our human error and shortcomings and we can begin to start anew.

I am in need of this reminder as a priest, brother, uncle, relative, and friend, and I rely on the mercy of others for my shortcomings, failures, or bad human judgment. I am forever grateful for the greatest gift given to mankind---our Lord Jesus Christ---who reminds me of the great virtues He exemplified and taught. Our lives are complete with the birth of our Lord and our hearts are more compassionate because of His sacrifice.

Let us reflect on the past and build on the future in the true Christian way---by beginning anew with one another and with Jesus Christ. May we understand our limitations of perfection and our boundless capacity of holiness, so that this New Year may be filled with the love and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.
