SUNDAY OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

A very common question I am asked is "Is there really a place as hell?" If there was any doubt about the answer to this question, it should be cleared up in today's gospel reading.

The past three weeks we have heard in the gospel readings so much about social justice and the way we should treat one another. These readings are preparing us for the Season of Lent- a time of fasting, prayer, and repentance.

Today's gospel reading is so vivid and so clear. The rich man is being punished for one reason---because he did nothing to help to someone in need. He had the means to ease the pain of a suffering man but he ignored him. It is that simple.

The interesting thing about this gospel reading is that the rich man, once he descended into hell, asked Abraham to go and tell his brothers what had happened so that they don't end up in hell. This request was of course denied.

What does it take for us to understand that our actions, or lack of, will be determined on our day of judgment? We have been warned; we have been instructed; and we have been given the truth that God will judge us accordingly.

So, what will it take for us to change our ways and to live the life that Jesus asks us? Brothers and sisters, the message is very clear: how we treat others is how we will be treated when our

judgment day comes. It should make us pause for some time and reflect on how we treat one another.

St. Paul tells us that we are children of the light. We have been given the truth about Jesus Christ and about his message of our judgment day. And if we don't understand this by everything that has been given to us, we will never understand it, not even if Abraham or Isaiah appeared to us and warned us.

My message to all of us is to prepare ourselves. This is our time to act accordingly. This is our time to see the face of God in every person we see. This is our time to help those who are in need, those who are less fortunate, those who need our love and help. Just as you did it to the least of these my brothers you did it to me. Jesus is quite serious about this and so should we be serious. My prayer for all of us is to see the face of God in everyone and to treat one another according to the Golden Rule---do unto to others and you would have them do unto you.
