SUNDAY OF THE ENTRANCE INTO LENT Miracle at Cana in Galilee

BEGINNING OF LENT

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption.

Why do we receive the ashes? Following the example of the Ninevites, who did penance in sackcloth and ashes, our foreheads are marked with ashes to humble our hearts and reminds us that life passes away on Earth. We remember this when we are told "Remember, Man is dust, and unto dust you shall return." Ashes are a symbol of penance made sacramental by the blessing of the Church, and they help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice.

The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.

GUIDELINES FOR FASTING DURING LENT

Great Lent is a season of fasting and abstinence. Abstinence from the consumption of meat and meat products is required for all persons over 14 years of age on all Fridays of Great Lent. Fasting from all food and beverages (except for water and medicine) from midnight until noon is obligatory for all persons between 14 and 60 years of age on the following two important days: Ash Monday (February 28th) Great Friday of the Crucifixion (April 15th)

Please note: Women who are pregnant and persons who are sick are not required to fast. Also, anyone who has a medical condition are also not required to follow these guidelines.
