NEW LIFE IN THE RESURRECTION

Massih Qam! Hakkan Qam! The Risen Lord has given us new life once again! Every year He gives us the opportunity to renew ourselves in faith and in our actions. What are we going to do with this "new life" that Jesus has given us? How can we give of ourselves for the greater glory of God?

Over the next few weeks, we will be listening to the Gospel readings that reflect the lack of faith of the apostles and the isolation they felt with the death of Jesus. Of course, it wasn't until Pentecost that the apostles truly understood all that Jesus told them. But there are many lessons we can learn from the time of Jesus' resurrection and Pentecost.

When we isolate ourselves, for whatever reason, we miss out on the joys of the parish community. We also miss out on lost opportunities to share the Word and to live out the Word of Jesus. This can create division and a feeling of loneliness in the community of faithful.

To celebrate Jesus' Resurrection, I encourage each of you to consider what you can do for your Church for the greater glory of God. To serve the Church is to serve Jesus. He calls each of us to give of ourselves for the building up of His Church and the building up each other. I am also calling upon you to give of yourselves in any capacity you can.

As many of you know by now, I want this community to be a united community. I appreciate how far we have come over the past 2 ¹/₂ years and I envision even more beyond what we have done. I also believe there are many in this community with great gifts to offer. I am calling on you now to bring these gifts to our Church and to share them among the faithful, always for the greater glory of God.


