SAINT BRENDAN THE NAVIGATOR Brendan of Clonfert (c. AD 484 - c.577)



St. Brendan is the patron saint of sailors and travelers. He is legendary for his travels throughout his life, among them his journey to the "Isle of the Blessed." He was nicknamed "the Voyager" in his lifetime and was one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland. Volumes upon volumes of work have been written about his legendary voyage. They give inspiration to all those who travel in this world, whether by sea or by land.

A St. Brendan medal frequently pays homage to the U.S. Navy. St. Brendan himself will usually hold a cross and be standing near a sea vessel or a representation of a boat. It is his strength in God that is most memorable as he journeyed through the world and faced many great adventures. This same strength is portrayed in the medallions that help remind us of God's love and comfort as we travel to and from our respective destinations. Brendan the Navigator or Brénainn moccu Alti as he is often known in the medieval Irish tradition is the patron saint of two Irish dioceses, Kerry and Clonfert. FOOD FOR THOUGHT

In the gospel reading for today, Jesus asks Simon Peter three times "Do you love me?" And each time Simon Peter answers Jesus "you know that I love you", Jesus responds by saying "Tend my sheep." Jesus poses this same question to each of us regarding this same love he asked Simon Peter. In order to respond yes to Jesus, we are told to tend His sheep. Do we truly love Jesus? If so, we must tend His sheep.

Jesus repeated Himself three times to Simon Peter, and he repeated Himself many times to His disciples and His people. This repetition was necessary because of our need to constantly remind ourselves that we must love and care of each other. It is a wonderful start to attend liturgy each week and fulfill our obligation as Catholics. It would be even more wonderful if we carried the words of Jesus Christ in our hearts and lived them in our daily lives. This is a challenge for all of us. Hence, repetition is a necessity.

With love we are able to redeem ourselves, to wash away anger and hostility, and to change the minds and hearts of others. In the letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, he tells us that"Faith, hope, and love; the greatest of these is love." Why do we hear throughout Sacred Scripture so many teachings and see so many examples of love as the centerpiece of our Catholic faith? Why do the gospels and letters constantly drive in our minds "love" and its' importance? Brothers and sisters, Jesus asks each of us whether we love Him. Being here is the first step in expressing our love for God---continuing outside of these four walls is the epitome of this expression. "Do you love me? Tend my sheep." May each of us say today that "Now I begin to love my God."

Problem solving

A father left 17 Camels as an asset for his three Sons. When the Father passed away, his sons opened up the will. The will of the father stated that the eldest son should get half of 17 camels, The middle son should be given 1/3rd of 17 camels, youngest son should be given 1/9th of the 17 camels. As it is not possible to divide 17 into half or 17 by 3 or 17 by 9, the sons started to fight with each other.

So, they decided to go to a wise man. The wise man listened patiently about the will. The wise man, after giving this thought, brought one of his camels and added the same to 17. That increased the total to 18 camels. Now, he started reading the deceased father's will.

Half of 18 = 9. So, he gave 9 camels to the eldest son.

1/3rd of 18 = 6. So, he gave 6 camels to the middle son.

1/9th of 18 = 2. So, he gave 2 camels to the youngest son.

Now add up: 9 + 6 + 2 = 17. This leaves one camel, which the wise man took back. All were happy.

MORAL: The attitude of negotiation and problem solving is to find the 18th camel i.e., the common ground. Once a person is able to find the common ground, the issue is resolved. It is difficult at times.


However, to reach a solution, the first step is to believe that there is a solution. If we think that there is no solution, we won't be able to reach any!
