TWELFTH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST

REFLECTION ON MOVNG PAST DIFFICULT SITUATIONS

Pope Francis has said there is "no point" in people going to church if they do not follow the teachings of the Bible in their daily lives.

The head of the Catholic Church took a stand against what he termed "Christian parrots", who talk a lot about their religion but don't do good deeds. "If I say I am Catholic and go to mass, but then don't speak with my parents, help my grandparents or the poor, go and see those who are sick, this does not prove my faith, there's no point," he told young residents of Guidonia, a village near Rome.

"Those who do this are nothing but Christian parrots – words, words, words," said the Pope, according to Italian newspaper *La Stampa*.

"Christian faith is expressed with three things: words, the heart, and the hands." Canon law requires Catholics to go to church "on Sundays and other holy days of obligation" and to abstain from work or other business that would inhibit their worship on those days.

During his conversation with the parishioners, Pope Francis also said it could be difficult to forgive people when they have hurt you, or even, in some cases, committed crimes against you.

"It's difficult, I knew an old woman who was strong, bright, whose husband used to hit her. You should always forgive but sometimes to forget is difficult," he said, according to *La Stampa* and a more detailed report on the website Famiglia Cristiana. "When you're at war with someone, your heart is wounded by hate and hostility, and those wounds can hurt, but you need to forgive them and not go to that person to forgive them like an enemy.

"Forgiveness needs to be given with the heart, even if you don't say it out loud, by treating that person as if nothing had happened."

I am a firm believer that there are always two sides to a story. And in between lays the truth, for the simple reason that when we have a problem with others, the smallest and most insignificant word or action is magnified 10 times more because of our distrust and disdain for others. We all want to believe we are right. We all want to believe that our accounts are the correct ones because we can validate our perception as the only valid one. And there is no need to talk about it with each other because "I am right!"

"Your opponent, the devil, is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour." That is what the devil does. He wants to interrupt God's goodness in His creation. That is his main goal---to cause division among God's people. The only unity the devil is in favor of is the unity of division and the destruction of the people of God. Once we recognize this and see it for what it is, only then can we move past the division that we are faced with.

Pope Francis leaves these following words as his last words in this reflection. "Forgiveness needs to be given with the heart, even if you don't say it out loud, by treating that person as if nothing had happened." For many of us these words don't make that much sense. How can we forgive with our hearts and act as nothing ever happened? The answer is simple. If we realize that there are two sides of a story and in between lays the truth, it is much easier to get past this hurt we feel by acknowledging that perhaps both parties had a hand to play in the devil's work. That not one person is always right. That our perception of a situation can be tainted by a dislike we may have for others. And it is at that moment that healing and forgiveness can begin to take root.

If someone who you feel has hurt you have invited you to talk about it, take them up on that offer. And I you don't want to do that forgive with the heart by treating that person as if nothing ever happened. Take that from Jesus who was and always will be the epitome of this quote. God bless all of you.

FEAST DAY OF SAINT TITUS



A disciple and companion of St. Paul to whom the great saint addressed one of his letters. Paul referred to Titus as "my true child in our common faith". Not mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, he was noted in Galatians where Paul writes of journeying to Jerusalem with Barnabas, accompanied by Titus. He was then dispatched to Corinth, Greece, where he successfully reconciled the Christian community there with Paul, its founder. Titus was later left on the island of Crete to help organize the Church, although he soon went to Dalmatia. Croatia. According to of Eusebius Caesarea in the Ecclesiastical History, he served as the first bishop of Crete. He was buried in Cortyna (Gortyna), Crete; his head was later translated to Venice during the invasion of Crete by the Saracens in 832 and was enshrined in St. Mark's, Venice, Italy.
