FIRST SUNDAY OF THE HOLY CROSS



EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

September 14th, is the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. It remembers the retrieval of the Holy Cross, which had been found and preserved by Saint Helena, the mother of Constantine, (with the assistance of Patriarch Saint Macarius) but had fallen into the hands of King Khosrau of Persia. Emperor Heraclius recovered the sacred relic and returned it to Jerusalem 629. The feast commemorates three distinct historical events: the finding of the True Cross, its return in the 7th century, and its ineffable power as the instrument of Christ's redemptive sacrifice and our salvation. Regarding the later, our Savior's crucifixion imbues human suffering with dignity and divine purpose.

The cross, a symbol of Christ's victory over death, gives us strength during our times of hardships and sadness. The cross becomes for us a daily sign of the great love that Jesus has for His people. As we have seen so many times through the persecution, tragedy, and martyrdom of others, the cross has been a source of courage, solace, and peace, knowing that Jesus gave us our salvation and our place in His kingdom through this visible act of love on a cross.


Today we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross because of the meaning it holds for us. In our Lenten prayers the cross was once referred to as the "wood of shame", but Jesus transformed it into the "wood of victory." We have been given hope through the symbol of the cross---a hope that rekindles our faith through tragedy and joy. It is a hope that just as Jesus suffered through the cross; we too must share in our suffering. But ultimately, it is our hope that through the Holy Cross, we will share in the greatest gift God has given to us---the kingdom of heaven. This is our salvation.

As we celebrate this beautiful feast let us gaze our eyes on the cross everyday as a source of strength, courage, and hope, so that through His cross we can conquer evil and sin and share in His resurrection.

FEAST OF SAINT THECLA



According to a popular second century tale, Acts of Paul and Thecla, she was a native of Iconomium who was so impressed by the preaching of St. Paul on virginity that she broke off her engagement to marry Thamyris to live a life of virginity. Paul was ordered to be scourged and banished from the city for his teaching, and Thecla was ordered burned to death. When a storm providentially extinguished the flames, she escaped with Paul and went with him to Antioch. There she was condemned to wild beasts in the arena when she violently resisted the attempt of Syriarch Alexander to kidnap her, but again escaped when the beasts did no harm to her. She rejoined Paul at Myra in Lycia, dressed as a boy, and was commissioned by him to preach the Gospel. She did a time in Iconium and then became a recluse in a cave at Meriamlik near Seleucia. She lived as a hermitess there for the next seventy-two years and died there (or in Rome, where she was miraculously transported when she found that Paul had died and was later buried near his tomb). The tale had tremendous popularity in the early Church but is undoubtedly a pious fiction and was labeled apocryphal by St. Jerome. Her feast day is September 24.




