



# **FIFTH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL**

FEAST OF BLESSED YAACUB HADDAD THE CAPUCHIN



Yaaqub El-Haddad, the third off eight children in the family of Boutros Haddad and Shams Haddad, was born in Ghazir, Lebanon on the outskirts of Beirut on 1stFebruary 1875. He was baptised in the Maronite church in Ghazir on 21stFebruary 1875 and received the name Khalil. At the age of sixteen, after a high school education in Beirut, he emigrated to Alexandria where he was touched by the death of a Capuchin Friar. In the novitiate he received the name Jacques. He was ordained a priest on 1stNovember 1901 in Beirut. The Eucharist and the Cross were the sources of his intense apostolic and charitable activity. As an itinerant preacher from 1903 to 1914 he walked all over Lebanon proclaiming the Word of God and was given the name "the Apostle of Lebanon". He was also seen preaching in Syria, Palestine, Iraq, and

Turkey. Brother Jacques was tireless. He would help anyone in need following in the footsteps of Saint Francis of Assisi. In 1920, to assist him in this mission to help the sick and the poor, he founded the Franciscan Sisters of the Holy Cross of Lebanon. In 1933 he opened the House of the Sacred Heart in Deir el-Kamar, a girls' orphanage, which later became an asylum for the chronically ill. In 1948 he opened the Hospital of Our Lady for the aged, the chronically ill, and the paralyzed. In 1949 Saint Joseph's Hospital became one of the most important medical centers of the capital. It was followed in 1950 by Saint Anthony's House in Beirut for beggars and vagabonds whom the police found on the streets, and Providence House for homeless girls. Even though Brother Jacques was very busy with the hospital mission, he and his sisters carried on the important work of education and opened several schools as well as an orphanage for 200 girls. Brother Jacques was worn out by vigils, fatigue, and travel. Although he suffered from numerous illnesses, became almost completely blind, and was stricken with leukemia, he did not stop blessing God and working. He was lucid to the end. His last hours were an uninterrupted series of prayers invoking the Cross and the Virgin Mary until he died on 26<sup>th</sup>June 1954 in Lebanon. On Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup>June 2008, he was beatified during a special Mass in Beirut by Cardinal José Saraiva Martins C.M.F., Prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

# FEAST OF SAINTS ZECHARIAH AND ELIZABETH

Zachariah (f'irst century) The father of St. John the Baptist, also listed as He Zachary. was a priest in the temple of Jerusalern, the husband of St. Elizabeth, a cousin of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Receiving a vision from an angel. Zachariah was told that Elizabeth would bear a son named John. Zachariah was struck dumb until John was born. The birth of John the Baptist was recorded in Luke, chapter one. A minor tradition states that Zachariah was slain in the temple when he refused to tell King Herod where St. John the Baptist could be found.

What we know of St. Elizabeth comes from the Gospel, the book of Luke, in particular. In Luke, Elizabeth, a

Elizabeth is also a cousin to the Virgin Mary.

Zechariah, desiring a child, went to pray in the temple and was told by the angel Gabriel. "Do not be afraid. Zechariah: your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born." (Luke 1:13-15). Zechariah was skeptical because both himself and his wife were elderly. For his skepticism, Zechariah was rendered mute until the prophecy had been fulfilled.

Elizabeth became pregnant shortly thereafter and she rejoiced.

Gabriel then visited the Virgin Mary at Nazareth, telling her that she would conceive of the Holy Spirit and become the mother of Jesus.

Mary then visited Elizabeth, and her baby leapt in her womb. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth proclaimed to Mary, Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!" (Luke 1:41-45).

Mary visited with Elizabeth for three months, both women pregnant with child. After Mary returned home, Elizabeth gave birth to a son and named him John. This child was chosen by God to be John the Baptist. John would baptize Christ as an example to all, that all must be reborn of water and spirit.

Although Elizabeth's neighbors assumed the child would be named Zechariah, her husband insisted that John be his name. This astonished the neighbors for there were no men named John in Elizabeth's family, but Zechariah's insistence ended the debate. At the moment, Zechariah insisted that they obey the will of God, and name him John, his speech returned. After this, there is no more mention in the Bible about Elizabeth.
