IF YOU WANT TO LEARN THEOLOGY, HAVE A DISCUSSION WITH A KID!

Children generally start asking questions at the age of 4-5 and go deeper into their questions at the age of 8. The "why" stage is characterized by an abundance of questions as children strive to make sense of their environment and expand their knowledge. They may ask about various topics such as the nature of different things or phenomena. In 2019, I was teaching CCD and one of the kids asked a very theological and deep question. He asked about the Trinity and how we can have three gods that are one God at the same time. I did not have the answer to explain it right at that moment, so I thanked him for his important question and promised to answer him the next session.

I went home and did some research on how I can describe such a complicated topic to an 8-year-old kid, and the next week I came back with an answer!

I used an orange to demonstrate the concept of the Trinity. The orange has three parts: the skin, the flesh, and the core. The three parts are not different oranges, they are all still one orange, yet they are all uniquely different. Each part of the orange has a different function, yet they are all an orange. The Trinity, the three persons of God: God the Father, the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are not three gods. They are one, but each one has his own function. The skin of the orange is like God the Father because He protects. The flesh is like the Son because Jesus took on human flesh, came to earth, and resurrected to give us new life. The core of the orange contains seeds that grow if placed into fertile ground. These seeds are like the Holy Spirit because, through the power of God, we will grow in faith.

Trinitarian Theology is one of the most complex topics to talk about and understand. It is often described as a mystery because it attempts to explain the nature of God, which is beyond human comprehension. It involves the simultaneous existence of three distinct persons who are each fully God, yet there is only one God.

On this Sunday gospel, Jesus sent His disciples into the world to preach the good news, and to baptize people in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit. As we read the gospel, we think that the message delivered is to be like the disciples to teach about Jesus and be His witnesses, but behind the text, a deep theological truth is hidden. The Trinity!


Jesus reminds us in this gospel that unless we change and become like children, we will never enter the kingdom of heaven. We are called to become humble like children and always seek and ask for the truth. Keep your hearts as children but have a mature mind!
