TENTH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST

A REFLECTION ON OUR PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE

I begin this reflection with a personal story, and I ask you to keep this person in prayer. Last year, my grade school classmates organized a reunion for the students at Holy Cross Elementary School, as well as the teachers who taught there for so many years. We honored the teachers and Sisters who taught us, disciplined us, and loved us with a tough and Christlike love.

As we reminisced over the long weekend, a resounding sentiment was heard. This school, these teachers, these religious, were the foundation of who we would become as adults. Many of us had made mistakes along the way and many of us lost contact with friends from the past. But what we all understood and felt that weekend was that this humble school, comprised of different ethnicities, social and economic backgrounds, yielded a cohesive bond amongst all of us. To this day, we remember fondly Sr. Rita, Sister Marianne, Miss Potter, Sr. Juanita Marie, and our recently departed Sr. Karen. These mentors who cared about their students with love and discipline would be remembered more than 50 years since I was a student there. This was the sentiment of all those who came.

This leads me to the present! All of us have a history and probably remember with great fondness and admiration those who shaped our lives as teachers and religious. We must never forget where we came from and those who were responsible for shaping our lives that has gotten us to this point. With our busy lives and schedules, we often forget to look back and remember those who have crossed our paths, those who made a significant difference in our lives, and to thank them and say a prayer for them. As we think about the future, we are reminded of those who taught us about our faith, the importance of the Holy Trinity, and who were examples of loving others with both a gentle and firm love, keeping in mind that their goal was to lead us all to Christ.

Today, a new future begins for Our Lady of Purgatory. It is a future that is filled with promise and hope. It is a new journey of faith that depends on our belief that the Church Jesus instituted, is a church that deserves our zeal and commitment to ensure our salvation. It is a Church that one may have disagreements with others, but in the end, it is a Church in which all are united in the common goal---our salvation in Christ Jesus.

As we reflect about the future, I am once again reminded that even our Church community is much like my days in elementary school. Our community is made up of different ethnicities, different languages, and social and economic backgrounds. But what unites us to yield the same cohesive bond, is our faith and belief in Christ Jesus. What unites us is knowing that our Church, Our Lady of Purgatory, is a place for everyone to come and worship, regardless of ethnicity, language, and social and economic backgrounds. It is a place where our Maronite spirituality may be practiced and embraced by all.

Looking back to my Holy Cross days, I didn't always agree with the Sisters. I didn't always believe they had my best interest when I was scolded, paddled, or disciplined. But as I look back to those many years ago, one thing is clear: they loved us and prepared us to make a difference in this world. Sometimes it

Today, I ask you to remember those people from the past. The past priests who made an impact on your lives, the religious who cared for you and taught you, and I ask you to say a prayer for them. I ask you to thank them for their sacrifice and mentorship. And today, I ask you to join me in saying a prayer for one of those incredible mentors who has had a direct impact on my life since I was 6 years old. Sister Juanita Marie, who sacrificed her life for Christ's flock, who gave of herself for the children she was responsible for, and to ask for God's mercy as she battles pancreatic cancer. We receive more than we give; they have given me much. May all of us in return give to each other and to Christ Jesus.
