IS CONFESSION REALLY NECESSARY?

As we approach the season of Lent, this is a time when we should examine our relationship with God and each other. It is a time to begin to walk the road with Jesus as He begins our journey with Him. This journey into Lent should renew our strong faith and to bring us closer to God by our words, deeds, and actions.

The first line of the first chapter from the Catechism of the Catholic Church begins like this: "The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for." Read this over a few times and let these words resonate in your hearts and minds because this is the reason for our existence.

The desire for God is written in the human heart from our birth and this desire constantly grows with the holy sacraments and our understanding of who God is. The birth of Jesus Christ begins this understanding, and it is enhanced and

strengthened as we begin to see and hear the teachings of Jesus Christ and ultimately witnessing His passion, death, and resurrection.

One of the seven pillars of Catholic Spirituality is confession (reconciliation). Confession is a holy sacrament that Jesus gave to His disciples so that each person would have the opportunity to draw closer to God. When we sin, we break this relationship with God. Each of us knows when we have done something wrong that goes against the teachings of Jesus. How do we know this? When this happens, we feel guilty or bad about what we may have said or done. We know that we have done something that goes against His This feeling that our command. relationship with God has been severed causes us to move away from His love. That is why Jesus gave us this holy sacrament of confession. That is why Jesus said to St. Peter, "Whatever you bound on earth will be bound in heaven and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." This power of forgiveness of sins moves our human heart closer to God and makes us examine our conscience so that we will ultimately

do what is right and fitting in the sight of God.

Confession is key in our relationship with God. Jesus' ministry begins with John the Baptist announcing "Repent, prepare the way of the Lord." And this message continued when Jesus began his ministry with the words "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." The meaning of the word "repent" means "to turn back to The best way that we can accomplish this "turning back to Him" is through confession. None of us can walk through this world without repenting no matter how hard we try. So, we rely on the mercy of God and the sacrament of penance or reconciliation. We rely on this gift of turning to God and asking for His


