TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

The Transfiguration of Our Lord – A Glimpse of Glory and the Call to Transformation

In the Gospel account of the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1–9; Mark 9:2–10; Luke 9:28–36), Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. There, before their eyes, He is transfigured—His face shining like the sun and His clothes dazzling white. Moses and Elijah appear beside Him, and a voice from the cloud declares, "This is my beloved Son; listen to Him."

This moment is far more than a dramatic revelation of Christ's divinity. It is a turning point in the journey of discipleship. As Jesus begins to walk toward His Passion, He first allows His closest friends to see His glory—not to escape the suffering to come, but to strengthen them for it. The mountaintop is not the destination; it is the vision that sustains the climb down into the valley of the cross.

The appearance of Moses and Elijah represents the Law and the Prophets, affirming that Jesus is the fulfillment of all salvation history. The cloud and the divine voice echo God's presence at Mount Sinai. This is a theophany—a divine manifestation—reminding us that Jesus is not just a teacher or prophet but the very Son of God.

The Transfiguration also speaks to us. We, too, are called to be transfigured—not with shining faces, but with changed hearts. Saint Paul tells us, "And we all, with unveiled faces, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image" (2 Corinthians 3:18). As we gaze upon the glory of Christ—especially

in prayer, Scripture, and the Eucharist—we are changed from within.

Yet the disciples' first response was fear and confusion. Peter, overwhelmed, wants to build tents and stay on the mountain. But the voice interrupts: "Listen to Him." The command is clear: stop clinging to comfort, and follow Christ through the coming suffering, into resurrection life.

In our own lives, we may have moments of clarity, peace, or spiritual "highs." But the true mark of faith is not staying in those moments—it is taking their light into the darkness of our daily struggles, our doubts, and the crosses we carry. The Transfiguration assures us that beyond every Good Friday lies an Easter morning, and that God's glory is not distant—it is revealed, even now, in the face of Christ and in the quiet transformation of every heart that listens to Him.

Reflection Questions for the Week:

- When have I experienced moments of God's glory—however brief or subtle?
- Do I listen to Jesus even when His path leads through discomfort or suffering?
- In what ways is God calling me to be transfigured—to reflect Christ more fully?

Lord Jesus, on the holy mountain, you revealed Your glory to Your disciples, shining with light brighter than the sun. In that moment, you showed us that You are truly the Son of God and gave us hope in the glory that awaits all who follow You. Help us to listen to You, to hear Your voice in the quiet of our hearts, in the words of Scripture, and in the life of the

Church. When we face trials or carry heavy crosses, remind us that You Walk with us, and that Your light is stronger than any darkness. Transform us, Lord, not just in moments of prayer, but in our daily lives that we may reflect Your love, Your peace, and Your truth to others.


