TWELFTH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST

FAITH THAT WON'T LET GO

Faith is trusting in God's goodness and promises, even when we cannot see the outcome. It's not only believing in our hearts—it's living as though God's word is true, especially when the path is uncertain.

Gospel of Saint Matthew 15:21–28, the Canaanite woman shows us this kind of faith. She cries out to Jesus for her daughter's healing. At first, there is silence. Then, even when told His mission is to Israel, she kneels before Him and continues to plead. Her trust is so deep that she refuses to let go. And Jesus answers her, "Woman, great is your faith!"

Faith is not passive. It moves our feet, strengthens our voices, and keeps us praying when answers seem far away.

During the Nazi occupation of the Netherlands, a Christian woman named Corrie ten Boom and her family hid Jewish neighbors in their home, knowing they could be arrested—or worse. When asked why she risked her life, she said, "Faith is a bridge you cannot see all the way across, but you step on it because you know it will hold." Her trust in God moved her to act courageously, just as the Canaanite woman's faith moved her to keep asking.

Like them, we are called to a faith that won't let go—a faith that prays, serves, and loves persistently, trusting that the One we lean on will never fail us.

Saint Eutyches, commemorated in the Orthodox tradition on **August 24**, was a devoted disciple of both Saints John the

Theologian and Paul. Recognized as a bishop for his apostolic labors, he was described as "full of the grace of the Holy Spirit." Ultimately, he suffered a brutal martyrdom: enduring starvation, beatings with iron rods, being thrown into fire, and even wild beasts. Tradition records that when a lion was released upon him, it praised the Creator in a human voice. Eutyches' life ended by beheading in his hometown in the early second century.

Saint Eutyches' story presents a profound picture of faith in action: **Rooted in Apostolic Teaching** He stood firm in the faith passed down from the Apostles John and Paul—faith he lived out even in the face of persecution. **Overcoming Terror with Devotion.**

His encounters—beatings, hunger, fire, and beasts—did not sway him. Instead, his faith seemed to grow, manifesting in the miraculous moment when the lion honored God as he approached. A Witness Even unto Death His willingness to endure execution rather

willingness to endure execution rather than renounce Christ reflects a faith so deeply formed it could not be compromised.

Saint Eutyches of Sebastia exemplifies a faith that endures—not because trials are absent, but because one clings to God even amid the fiercest storms.


He learned directly from the Apostles: faith rooted in Christ builds courage when all falls apart.

Let his example inspire us this week: may our faith be nourished in the Word, unwavering in suffering, and compelling in its witness to others even when no one else seems to notice.


