FOURTEEN SUNDAY OF PENTECOST

REFLECTION ON SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL (PATRON OF POLICE OFFICERS)



Among the archangels, St. Michael is perhaps the most well-known and beloved. His very name is a proclamation of faith: "Who is like God?" This is not just a title, but a challenge—a reminder that no creature, no force, and no temptation can ever compare with the majesty and power of God.

St. Michael appears in Scripture as the great protector of God's people. In the Book of Revelation, he leads the heavenly armies in the battle against Satan and the fallen angels, casting them out of heaven (Revelation 12:7–9). In the Book of Daniel, he is described as the guardian of Israel, the one who stands watch over God's people. Throughout the history of the Church, devotion to St. Michael has grown because of his role as both a defender against evil and a faithful servant of God's will.

Why is he so important for us today? Because the struggle he represents is not just an ancient story, it is also the reality of our own lives. We may not see the battles of angels, but we all experience the battles of the heart: temptations, doubts, pride, fear, and the daily challenges of

remaining faithful to God in a world that often pulls us away from Him. St. Michael reminds us that this is not a battle we fight alone. He stands beside us as a protector, a warrior for our souls, and a reminder that Christ's victory has already been won

From St. Michael we can learn three key lessons:

- 1. **Humility before God** His name, "Who is like God?" reminds us that we are not the center, God is. Pride is the root of sin, but humility opens us to grace.
 - Courage in the face of evil Michael did not remain silent when confronted with rebellion. Likewise, we are called to resist sin and injustice, even when it is difficult or unpopular.

Confidence in God's victory – St. Michael teaches us not to lose hope. Evil may seem strong for a time, but God's love is stronger, and His triumph is assured.

As we reflect on St. Michael's role, let us also remember that devotion to him is not just about protection, but about transformation. To ask his intercession is to commit ourselves to living with the same courage, humility, and faithfulness that he embodies.

May St. Michael the Archangel defend us in our daily battles, guard us from harm, and lead us closer to the heart of Christ, where the ultimate victory has already been won.

St. Michael the Archangel, **protector of police officers**, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.






