



### EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS



The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross—a day the Church sets aside not just to venerate a wooden instrument of death, but to gaze upon the mystery it holds:

The Paradox of the Cross the Cross is, on the surface, a scandal and a contradiction. In the Roman world it was the most humiliating form of execution—a symbol of defeat, shame, and terror. Yet in Christ, the Cross is lifted and "exalted" as the throne of victory, the bridge between heaven and earth.

What humanity intended for destruction, God transformed into redemption. The wood of death became the tree of life. This paradox is the very heart of our faith: God's glory is revealed not in power and dominance, but in surrender, vulnerability, and love.

The Cross as Revelation of God's Love when we look at the Cross, we don't simply see pain; we see love poured out "to the end" (John 13:1).

The Cross tells us that God does not

remain distant from human suffering. He enters it, bears it, and transforms it. Every wound we carry—of rejection, loss, betrayal, fear—has already been carried on those beams.

The Cross, then, is not only an event in history but a constant assurance: "Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:39).

The Cross in Our Daily Life to Exalt the Cross is not merely to honor a relic or symbol; it is to embrace its meaning in our lives.

Each person's "cross" might be illness, family struggles, loneliness, or hidden sacrifices.

To carry the cross is not to seek suffering but to accept that love requires self-gift, perseverance, and sometimes loss.

When borne with Christ, our crosses are no longer crushing weights but paths to resurrection. The Cross is never the end of the story—it always points to Easter morning.

The Cross and Transformation of the Cross changes the way we see the world: Power is redefined strength is shown in weakness.

Victory is redefined life comes through death.

Success is redefined—not in what we achieve, but in how deeply we love.

The world teaches us to run from anything crooked, broken, or weak. But the Cross tells us that God enters precisely there. If we exalt the Cross, we begin to see the broken places in ourselves and others not as obstacles, but as openings for God's grace.

#### A Personal Reflection

Whenever we trace the sign of the Cross, we are claiming both our identity and our hope. We mark ourselves with the greatest love story in history. Personally, one of the deepest challenges is to remember this in moments of fear or failure. The Cross whispers: "Your worth is not measured by success, but by the One who gave His life for you."

I sometimes think of the Cross as a compass: it points upward (to God), downward (to our humility and

rootedness), and outward (to our brothers and sisters). To live under the Cross is to orient our lives in all three directions.

Brothers and sisters, each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we claim this mystery for ourselves: we belong to Christ who has conquered through love. The Cross is our compass—pointing us upward to God, grounding us in humility, and stretching us outward in service to others.

So today, let us not only gaze upon the Cross, but *live* it: in our patience, our forgiveness, our compassion, our daily sacrifices. For in the Cross, we find not death, but life—eternal life in Him who loved us to the end

In short: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross is a feast that teaches us the mystery of God's upside-down wisdom: that glory is hidden in suffering, that life springs from death, and that love transforms everything it touches.

"We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world."






