FEAST OF SAINT JOHN THE EVANGELIST AND

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Vincent de Paul — two saints separated by centuries but united in one Gospel of love: Two Saints, Two Eras, One Lord! St John: Who he was: John was one of the Twelve Apostles, the "beloved disciple" who rested on Jesus' chest at the Last Supper. He stood at the foot of the Cross with Mary and was entrusted with her care. He later wrote the Gospel of John, three letters, and the Book of Revelation.

What we celebrate: The Church celebrates his feast on December 27, during the Christmas season, because he bore witness to the mystery of the Incarnation: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). He is the evangelist of love, light, and intimacy with God.

Key focus: John teaches us that discipleship is rooted in love and deep union with Christ.

Saint Vincent: Who he was: Born in 1581 in France, Vincent became a priest who devoted his life to the poor, the sick, and the marginalized. He founded the Congregation of the Mission

(Vincentians) and co-founded the daughters of Charity with St. Louise de Marillac.

What we celebrate: The Church honors him on September 27. He is the patron saint of charitable works, hospitals, prisoners, and the poor.

Key focus: Vincent reminds us of that love of God is inseparable from love of neighbor, especially the most vulnerable. His legacy lives on in the worldwide Society of St. Vincent de Paul, dedicated to serving the poor.

This week we celebrate two great saints of the Church: Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Vincent de Paul.

Saint John walked beside Jesus, leaned on His heart at the Last Supper, and stood beneath the Cross with Mary. He is the "beloved disciple," the witness of divine intimacy, the evangelist who wrote: "God is love" (1 John 4:8).

Saint Vincent lived sixteen centuries later in France, a world full of poverty, war, and injustice. He did not write a Gospel, but he "wrote" Christ's love in action—feeding the hungry, clothing the naked,and organizing care for orphans, widows, and the sick.

Though their lives look very different, both saints reveal the same truth: the heart of Christianity is **love made real**.

Saint John: Love as Contemplation

John teaches us to *see* Christ. In his Gospel, he invites us to gaze on Jesus as the eternal Word made flesh, the Lamb of God, the true Light. John reminds us that faith begins with intimacy—with resting close to the heart of Christ, with knowing we are beloved. This is the contemplative dimension of faith: prayer, silence, and union with God.

Saint Vincent: Love as Action

Vincent teaches us to serve Christ. He saw Christ alive in the poor, saying: "The poor are our masters, and we are unworthy to render them our small services." For Vincent, love was never abstract, bread for the hungry, medicine for the sick, comfort for the prisoner, and justice for the forgotten. This is the active dimension of faith: service, sacrifice, and works of mercy.

What The two Saints hold in Common?

At first glance, John the mystic and Vincent the servant may seem different. But together, they show us the full shape of Christian life:

Love of God and love of neighbor. John teaches us to receive divine love; Vincent teaches us to give it away. Contemplation and action. John leaned on Christ's heart; Vincent touched Christ's wounds in the poor. Witness to

Christ. John witnessed with his words; Vincent witnessed with his deeds.

Their lives together echo Jesus' command at the Last Supper: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (John 13:34).

The Challenge for Us brothers and sisters is their feast invites us to ask: Do I make time to rest on Christ's heart like John, through prayer, Scripture, and the sacraments? Do I recognize Christ in the suffering like Vincent, through compassion, service, and mercy?

Faith cannot remain only in the heart or only in the hands—it must be both. True discipleship is love that flows from contemplation into action.

Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Vincent de Paul remind us that the Gospel is not simply a book to be read or a charity to be done—it is a way of life, shaped by love.

May John teach us to remain close to the heart of Christ, and may Vincent teach us to serve that heart in the poor. And may we, like them, become living witnesses that *God is love*—a love that prays, a love that serves, a love that transforms the world.
