## THIRD SUNDAY AFTER HOLY CROSS

### DEVOTED PASTOR, COMMITTED COMMUNITY AND THE HOLY CROSS

The Holy Cross is not just a relic of history. It is alive and visible in every act of self-giving love. When we look at the Cross, we see more than suffering, we see love poured out, a love so strong that it transforms death into life, weakness into strength, and smallness into abundance.

Sometimes, if we look carefully, we can see the mystery of the Cross reflected in people around us. They may not even realize it themselves. They do not boast, they do not pay attention to their sacrifices, but by the way they live, they embody what it means to carry the Cross with love.

The Holy Cross stands at the center of our faith not as a symbol of defeat but of transformation. When we gaze at the Cross, we are reminded that Jesus carried the weight of all humanity—our sins, our regrets, our brokenness, even the emotions that chain us to the past. On the Cross, He shows us that no wound is too deep, no history too heavy, and no sorrow too strong for God to redeem.

Often, we cling to the past, our hurts, our failures, the times we felt betrayed or misunderstood. These attachments quietly drain our spirit and prevent us from seeing the newness God is preparing ahead. But the Cross teaches us surrender just as Christ let go of everything even His last breath into the Father's hands, so must we lay down our burdens at His feet. In doing so, the Cross becomes not just a place of pain, but a doorway to freedom.

When we release our attachments through the Cross, we are no longer held captive by resentment or nostalgia. We begin to see that our wounds can become wisdom, our failures can give birth to humility, and our sorrows can make us more compassionate. This is how the Cross transforms us from people clinging to the past into people ready to build the future. And this is not just about us individually, it is about our Church and community. A parish or community that learns from the Cross will not waste time on divisions, old grudges, or "the way things used to be." Instead, it will embrace the mission of Christ: to become a beacon of love, service, and truth. The Cross compels us to be voices encouragement, not complaint; voices of hope, not despair; voices that build up the Body of Christ, not tear it down.

Think of Simon of Cyrene, who helped carry the Cross. He didn't erase Christ's suffering, but he lightened the burden and walked beside Him. That is what the Cross calls us to do: not to live in the shadows of the past, but to move forward by being supportive voices—lifting one another, carrying the weight together, and walking toward the Resurrection.

### LET ME TELL YOU A STORY, ONE THAT IS CLOSER TO US THAN WE THINK.

There was a parish, small and struggling, with more empty pews than filled ones. Many wondered if it had a future. But then God, in His providence, sent a shepherd who carried the Cross not as a burden, but as a gift. With patience, he gave his time. With wisdom, he taught with clarity. With generosity, he opened his heart to the sick, the poor, and the lonely. He is not afraid of long days or hidden sacrifices, he is not afraid of working long hours beside everyone else, he is not afraid to lead by example, because he understood what the Cross means: that love is most powerful when it costs us something.

Slowly, that parish came alive. Families returned. Young people were inspired. The community grew not just in number but in faith. What seemed small and fragile became flourishing and strong. All of this happened not by accident, but because one person allowed the Cross to shape his ministry, giving, generous, caring, loving, deeply holy, and an example for all of us at least for me.

It reminds me of St. John Vianney, the Curé of Ars, who took a forgotten little parish in France and, through the power of the Cross, made it a place where heaven touched earth. His holiness was not in building something grand but in pouring out love, one soul at a time. That is the secret of every flourishing parish: not programs alone, not buildings alone, but a Cross-shaped heart at its center.

My brothers and sisters, this is what the Cross does, transforms small beginnings into great fruit. It turns sacrifice into abundance. And sometimes, without realizing it, we are blessed to witness this
