



FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER HOLY CROSS



Brothers and sisters in Christ, have you ever asked yourself if God allows Uturns?

Life often feels like a long road trip. Some days we know exactly where we're headed; other days we get distracted, take the wrong exit, or find ourselves lost on back roads. And if we're honest, there are moments in our spiritual journey when we drift far away from God through sin, neglect, or even indifference. But here is the Good News: **God allows U-turns.** In fact, God *welcomes* them. The heart of the Gospel is that no matter how far we wander, the way back to Him is always open.

Think of the *Parable of the Prodigal Son*. That young man thought he ruined his life. He wasted everything, broke his father's trust, and ended up in misery. But when he "came to his senses, he made a U-turn and went home. And the father didn't scold him or slam the door he ran to him, embraced him, and threw a feast. That's what God does for us every time we turn around.

Even Saint Peter needed a U-turn. He denied Jesus three times out of fear. Yet after the Resurrection, Christ asked him three times: "Do you love me?" Each answer was a chance to turn his failure into love. That U-turn didn't disqualify him—it transformed him into the leader of the Church.

A STORY OF A U-TURN

I once heard of a man driving on the highway who ignored the GPS instructions. He thought he knew better, but soon he found himself far from his destination. Frustrated, he expected the GPS to say, "You blew it! No more help for you." But instead, the voice simply said: "Recalculating... make a U-turn at the next exit."

Isn't that how God works? We expect condemnation, but He simply says: "Recalculating. Come back to me. Take the next U-turn."

Another story about a father teaching his son how to ride a bike. At first, he was so confident and pedaling fast, looking around, even letting go of the handlebars for a second. But of course, within moments, he drifted off the path, tipped over, and scraped his knee.

With tears in his eyes, he looked up at the father as if to say, "Am I done? Did I fail?" But instead of scolding him, the father picked him up, dusted him off, and said: "No, buddy, we just turn around and try again."

And it struck the father that this is exactly how God looks at us. He doesn't shake His head in disappointment when we fall or go off course. He bends down, lifts us up, and whispers: "Come on, let's turn around and try again."

Dear faithful, our faith journey isn't about never making a wrong turn. It's about trusting that **God's mercy is stronger than our mistakes.** Every confession is a U-turn. Every act of repentance is a U-turn. Every prayer whispered from a broken heart is a U-turn.

And here's the most amazing part: God doesn't just allow U-turns; He rejoices in them. Jesus tells us that heaven

itself throws a celebration when even one sinner returns.

So today, if you feel far away from God, if you've taken some wrong roads in life, don't despair. The way back is always open. Take the U-turn. And you'll discover that God has been waiting at home all along, ready to embrace you.

The road of faith isn't about perfection, it's about direction. And no matter how many wrong turns we've made, as long as we keep turning back to God, we'll always reach our true destination: eternal life with Him. "With God, it's never too late to make a U-turn—because His mercy is always waiting at the next exit."






