## SUNDAY OF THE CHRIST THE KING



Christ the King a title so majestic, so divine, yet one that reveals a mystery far beyond the crowns and thrones of this world. When we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, we do not behold a ruler seated upon a golden throne, draped in fine linen, surrounded by power and might. Instead, our King reigns from a wooden cross. His crown is made not of gold, but of thorns. His throne is lifted not in glory before men, but in humiliation before sinners. And yet, it is precisely from this paradox that the greatest truth of our faith shines forth that true kingship is found in love, and true glory is revealed in sacrifice.

When Jesus stood before Pilate, the governor asked Him, "Are you the King of Jews?" And Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world." That statement alone redefined forever what it means to rule, to govern, and to reign. Pilate could not understand it — for in his world, kings commanded armies, collected taxes, and exercised authority through fear.

But Christ's authority came from another realm, from the realm of truth and mercy. He did not conquer lands; He conquered hearts. He did not demand allegiance through force; He invited it through love. On the cross, when soldiers mocked Him, when passersby ridiculed Him, when even one thief cursed Him, He remained silent a King reigning through forgiveness. And when the other thief turned to Him and whispered, "Jesus, remember me when

you come into your kingdom," that criminal saw what no one else could see — that the cross was not the end, but the very gate of the Kingdom.

The cross, therefore, becomes the royal standard of our King. It is the banner under which we march as His disciples. In ancient times, kings would ride into battle carrying their standard, their emblem of victory. For us, that emblem is the cross. Every time we make the sign of the cross, we proclaim this is the throne of our King, and I belong to Him. When we face suffering, when we endure injustice, when we forgive rather than retaliate, we too bear that cross and share in His kingship.

There is a story told of a missionary who was preaching the Gospel in a remote village. He had erected a simple wooden cross outside his small chapel. One day, a local ruler came to him, dressed in splendor, and asked, "Why do you worship a God who died in weakness? Our gods stand tall and victorious". The missionary gently replied, "Our God chose to die so that we might live. He chose the cross not because He lacked power, but because love has no need to prove itself through might. It is in giving that love shows its power." The ruler left in silence, but months later returned, humbled, saying, "I have many servants, but none love me enough to die for me. Your King must be the true King."

That is the heart of Christ the King. A reign founded not on domination, but on service, not on coercion, but on compassion. His authority is not measured in wealth or power, but in the depth of His mercy. When we forgive our enemies, when we lift the broken, when we live not for ourselves but for others, we make His kingdom visible on earth. And just as He turned the instrument of death into the

sign of eternal life, He invites us to turn our own crosses into thrones of grace to let our pain become a place of love, and our trials a witness to faith.

Think of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the cross. She saw her Son, her King, suffering and dying, and yet she did not flee. She stood, steadfast in faith, knowing that this apparent defeat was divine victory. In her silence, she proclaimed what all creation would soon come to know that through the cross, Christ conquers. And when He rose, His crown of thorns became the crown of glory, His wounds the marks of triumph. So, when we honor Christ the King, we do not merely look upward to a distant ruler; we look inward to a Lord who reigns from the heart. The cross teaches us that power without love is tyranny but love that bears the cross is true kingship. Christ does not ask us to build palaces for Him, but to prepare our hearts as His throne. He does not seek to rule over us with force, but to reign within us through

In the end, every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. Yet that confession will not be out of fear, but out of love for we will see the King who bore our pain, who forgave our sins, and who turned death itself into life. The throne of Calvary will shine brighter than all the thrones of history, for it is the throne of love.

The one whose crown was woven from suffering and whose kingdom is built on mercy. To follow Him is to carry our cross with dignity, to love when it hurts, to forgive when it costs, and to believe that in the shadow of the cross, the light of the Kingdom already shines.




