



BEGINNING OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR CONSECRATION OF THE CHURCH



FEAST OF ALL SAINTS AND THE CONSECRATION OF THE CHURCH

"Be holy, for I am holy." (1 Peter 1:16) As we gather to celebrate the Feast of All Saints, we are reminded that holiness is not reserved for a few chosen souls or those whose statues we venerate on our altars. The saints were ordinary men and women who allowed God's extraordinary grace to work through them. Each of them whether a martyr, a confessor, a monk, a mother, a priest, or a child reflected the light of Christ in their own unique way.

We celebrate this feast because it reminds us that **heaven** is our destiny, and holiness is our calling. The saints show us that it *can* be done, that holiness is not about perfection, but about perseverance, not about greatness in the eyes of the world, but about faithfulness in the small things of God.

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux reminds us, "Holiness consists simply in doing God's will, and being just what God wants us to be." Saint Francis said, "Sanctify yourself, and you will sanctify society."

SO, HOW CAN WE FOLLOW IN THEIR FOOTSTEPS?

By striving to make our daily lives a prayer. By choosing mercy over judgment, humility over pride, love over indifference. By realizing that sainthood begins not in a monastery, but in our homes, in our marriages, in our workplaces, and in our hearts.

THE CALL TO HOLINESS: THE GOSPEL OF THE BEATITUDES

In today's Gospel, Jesus stands on the mount and proclaims the Beatitudes — the charter of holiness, the portrait of the saints.

He does not say, "Blessed are the successful, the powerful, or the admired." Instead, He says,

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are the merciful, blessed are the peacemakers, blessed are the pure in heart." These are the attitudes of heaven, the roadmap to sainthood.

The saints are those who lived these words not just with their lips, but with their lives.

They were poor in spirit: humble and dependent on God.

They were meek: choosing love over pride.

They were merciful: forgiving even their enemies.

They were pure in heart: seeking God above all things.

They were peacemakers: building unity where there was division. And they accepted suffering with hope, trusting that their reward was not of this world, but in heaven. That is why we celebrate them today — not to admire them from afar, but to follow in their footsteps.

QUOTE OF THE WEEK

The Solemnity of All Saints celebrates all those who are in Heaven, in the light of God's faceboth those recognised by the Church as Saints and those known only to the Lord.

We ask for their intercessionand we strive to follow their example, so that we too can fulfill our vocation to be saints.

THE MARONITE CHURCH: A NEW LITURGICAL YEAR— THE CONSECRATION OF THE CHURCH

In the Maronite tradition, the new liturgical year begins with the Consecration of the Church. This is profoundly symbolic, because before we journey through the seasons of Christ's life—from His birth to His resurrection we begin by renewing our identity as the living Church of Christ.

We are not only consecrating the building made of stone, wood, and marble—but consecrating *ourselves*—the living stones of God's temple. As Saint Paul tells us: "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3:16) This consecration should invite us to start anew with purified hearts, renewed faith, and consecrated lives.

CONSECRATING OUR MOUTH, HEART, AND HANDS

To consecrate the church means to set it apart for God's glory. To consecrate ourselves means to do the same.

As the Church's liturgical calendar turns a new page, we are invited to begin again—not with resolutions, but with renewal. Let us allow God to rebuild His Church within us. The saints remind us that every new beginning starts with a "yes" to grace.

May we, like them, say our daily "yes" to God, so that at the end of our journey, when the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints again next year, we might be a little closer to joining their company in the heavenly Church—the eternal feast of the saints.

PRAYER:

Lord, on this Feast of All Saints and at the dawn of our new liturgical year, consecrate our hearts to love You more deeply, our mouths to proclaim Your truth more boldly, and our hands to serve You more faithfully. Make us living temples of Your holiness. May the example of the saints guide us, and may Your Spirit renew the face of Your Church. Amen.


