

What Did Jesus Do?

“DO YOU SEE THE PAIN IN PEOPLE’S EYES?”

The season of Epiphany is about seeing. The Magi saw a star others ignored. John the Baptist saw Jesus and proclaimed, “Behold, the Lamb of God” (John 1:29). Epiphany reminds us that God reveals Himself but only to those who are truly looking.

Yet today, I want to ask a different Epiphany question: Do we see the pain in people’s eyes?

We live in a world where people smile easily but suffer deeply. Pain rarely announces itself loudly. It hides behind polite greetings, Sunday clothes, social media posts, and even faithful church attendance. Epiphany calls us not just to see Christ revealed but to see Christ hidden in wounded hearts.

Scripture tells us, “The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world” (John 1:9). Light exposes what is hidden not to shame, but to heal. When Christ enters a life, He reveals truth with mercy. When He enters our hearts, He teaches us to see others as He sees them. Jesus had this gift of seeing pain. He looked at Zacchaeus and saw loneliness behind greed (Luke 19). He looked at the

Samaritan woman and saw shame behind sarcasm (John 4).

He looked at Peter after the denial not with condemnation, but with love that broke his heart open (Luke 22:61).

People often say, “No one understands what I’m going through.” But Epiphany proclaims that God sees, and He invites us to become His eyes.

A Real-Life Story

I once met a man who never missed Mass. He was always polite, always helpful, always smiling. Many admired his faith. One day, after years of seeing him, I simply asked, “How are you really?” His eyes filled with tears. He said, “no one has asked me that in years.” He had lost his wife, was estranged from his children, and lived in quiet despair. His pain was invisible until someone chose to see.

That moment taught me something powerful: Sometimes the greatest act of faith is paying attention. Epiphany teaches us that God does not reveal Himself only through miracles and stars but through compassion, presence, and attentive love. St. Paul reminds us, “Bear one another’s burdens, and so you will fulfill the law of Christ” (Galatians 6:2). But we cannot carry burdens we refuse to notice. **Practically speaking**, seeing pain means:

Listening without rushing to fix it. Not judging what we don’t understand. Being patient with people seems difficult because pain often speaks through frustration. Offering presence instead of answers.

Emotionally, it means allowing ourselves to be moved. Jesus Himself “was moved with compassion” (Matthew 9:36). If we never feel disturbed by another’s suffering, we are not yet seeing with God’s eyes. Epiphany is not only about Christ being revealed to us, it is about Christ being revealed through us. When we notice pain, when we respond with mercy, when we choose kindness over indifference, the light of Christ shines again in the world.

So, this Epiphany, we should ask ourselves:

Who around me is carrying silent pain? Whose eyes have I passed without really seeing?

How can I let Christ’s light pass through me today? Because sometimes, the greatest revelation is not a star in the sky but rather a tear in someone’s eye that finally meets love.

“Arise, shine; for your light has come” (Isaiah 60:1). And that light begins when we choose to truly see.


